Adriatic College offers national and international educational programmes for children of all ages. The school is accredited by the Montenegrin Ministry of Education and is an accredited centre for the International Primary Curriculum (IPC), Pearson Edexcel Lower Secondary and Upper Secondary education, and the IB DP (International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme). We provide children with an education that meets the highest international standards.

Neuropsychological Preparation

The programme will help the child identify their zone of proximal development, ease socialisation, teach self-control, and plan learning activities in a playful manner.

Speech Development and Literacy

Training

The programme aids in developing fine motor skills of fingers and hand muscles, teaches writing in print, expands and activates vocabulary, and forms the ability to ask questions on topics of interest freely.

First Steps in Mathematics

The lessons will introduce the child to numbers and basic mathematical concepts, developing logical thinking.

Understanding the World

The lessons will familiarise the child with the surrounding world, teach them how to interact with objects, and develop an interest in observing nature.

English Language

The course will allow the child to get acquainted with English letters and words and lay the foundations of spoken language.



Our goal is to ensure a smooth transition from play to learning and uncover and develop each child's individual abilities.

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Primary School (Ages 6 - 11)

Adriatic College offers ideal conditions for each student's holistic development. With experienced teachers and diverse teaching methodologies, extracurricular activities, clubs and CRAFT circles, and extended day programmes, we have everything to make learning comfortable, interesting, and, most importantly, never dull. We aim for every student to love learning as an ongoing process of discovering something new and exciting.

A Playful Approach to Developing Social Skills

Our primary school teachers actively use playful teaching methods: presentations on lesson topics, vivid visual materials, group work, and organised games during lessons. All these activities develop children's communication skills.

Choosing an Educational Path: National and International Learning Programmes

Adriatic College offers two programmes for primary school:

International Primary Curriculum (IPC) for students aged 6 – 11

The International Primary Curriculum, developed by the International Curriculum Association in the UK, is used by over 1,000 schools worldwide.

A key element of the IPC is the harmonious integration of various subjects into interdisciplinary modules, which allows students to see and understand the connections between different areas of knowledge and their significance in the modern world.



National Montenegrin Programme of General Primary Education

The school strictly adheres to Montenegrin educational standards, which are based on the Russian educational programme and the officially approved programme for Montenegrin schools.

Pupil Support

We offer a comprehensive student support system, personalised attention, and additional elective courses. In electives on core subjects, students can delve deeper into a subject of interest or discuss a challenging topic with a teacher.

Secondary School (Ages 11 - 16)

Educational Programmes for Secondary School at Adriatic College

National Curriculum

Students explore a wide range of subjects, from natural sciences to humanities in Russian, following the curriculum approved by the Montenegrin Ministry of Education. We pay special attention to updating and adapting syllabi to provide our students with a contemporary and high-quality education.

Students receive a state-standard document at the end of each academic year - a certificate recognised in Montenegro and abroad. At the end of Year 9, we issue a Montenegrin secondary school leaving certificate, enabling our graduates to continue their education in any country worldwide.

British curriculum with Pearson Edexcel

The education programme from Pearson Edexcel includes two main age categories and offers English-medium instruction, making it ideal for preparing students for the international academic and professional arena.

For students aged 11 to 14, our school implements the Pearson Lower Secondary Programme, focusing on core subjects and the development of critical thinking. This stage prepares them for a deeper understanding of chosen disciplines.

The Pearson Upper Secondary Programme is designed for students aged 14 to 16 and prepares them for the International GCSE exams. Upon completing this programme, students may continue their education in the IB Diploma Programme at Adriatic College.

Preparation for the IB DP

A feature of the secondary school at Adriatic College is preparing students for the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme with the PreDP course included in the Year 9 curriculum. The course covers English and mathematics, which are essential for admission to the IB DP programme. The course prepares students for the international educational environment, as successfully passing the International Baccalaureate exams provides an opportunity to apply to universities worldwide.



The secondary school at Adriatic College is a stage of developing academic and social maturity. Students enhance their research, critical thinking, and analytical skills, as well as their independent learning skills.

Senior School (Ages 16-19)



Adriatic College's senior school offers the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IB DP), a two-year course designed for high school students and aimed at their comprehensive development.

The diploma awarded to students of the IB DP programme upon successfully passing international exams and completing course work is recognized by universities worldwide, opening additional opportunities for admission to higher education institutions in various countries.

The programme involves choosing subjects from six groups: native language, foreign languages, humanities, natural sciences, mathematics, and arts. The choice of subjects is determined by the student's interests and future education plans. Students study three subjects at the standard and three at the higher levels.

The Theory of Knowledge (TOK) course is an essential part of the programme, which fosters both critical and interdisciplinary thinking. The CAS (Creativity, Activity, Service) programme offers opportunities for creativity, physical activity, and volunteering, contributing to personal growth and the development of social responsibility.

The subject programmes and courses of the International Baccalaureate are relevant and regularly updated, on average, every five years, reflecting current trends in science and education. They are profoundly academic yet closely linked to real life, motivating students to continue studying their chosen disciplines.

Support for Creativity and Initiatives



The department's key tasks include caring for students' emotional states, assisting them in critical moments, and supporting them during the adaptation phase.

The school employs two qualified psychologists who are available for consultation by students, teachers, or parents on weekdays from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

All meetings with psychologists are free of charge. Whether discussing personal matters or just taking a break from the noise and people around you, the psychological support room is always quiet and very cozy. Our psychologists are not

just qualified specialists but friends with the students.

Security Service

At Adriatic College, we pay the utmost attention to security issues. The safety of students and school staff is an absolute priority.

Security at the school is provided by a state security officer, whose presence is mandatory for all accredited Montenegrin schools. One of the administrators is always on duty at the school's reception. Access to the school for guests and parents is strictly regulated. On days of holidays, festivals, and school events, parents are admitted to the school based on lists provided by class teachers.


Outdoor Lessons
